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PERSHING VA MEDICAL CENTER, FOOD BANK MOBILE FOOD PROGRAM FOR VETERANS TO BE EXPANDED

Sikeston, MO (January 20,2021) – The John J. Pershing VA Medical Center program that provides food for southeast Missouri veterans who are food insecure is being expanded thanks to a grant awarded to Southeast Missouri Food Bank.

The VA and the food bank have partnered to hold monthly mobile food distributions at the medical center for the past 18 months. The initial program was designed to serve about 50 veterans each month.

The new program will be expanded to serve 75 veterans each month. Each participant will receive a box with 35 to 40 pounds of fresh produce, lean protein and other foods.

"These veterans have made incredible sacrifices to protect the freedoms we enjoy," said SEMO Food Bank Chief Executive Officer Joey Keys. "They should not have to face hunger in the country they have served. We're excited about this opportunity to increase the number of veterans being served and improve the value of the food they will receive."

"Expanding the capacity of our current pantry lets us help more members of the veteran community who face limited resources and may not be able to access food through traditional means," said Ashley Aubuchon, health promotion disease prevention program manager for the VA Medical Center. "We also appreciate having more fresh produce because we know that when a veteran experiences food insecurity, they're more likely have diet-related chronic diseases, such as diabetes and high blood pressure. Access to healthy foods like these and education will go a long way in improving health outcomes for our veterans."

The Veterans Healthy Food Surplus, is part of the Health Promotion Disease Prevention Program at the Pershing VA Medical Center. The distributions will be held at 9 a.m. on the fourth Wednesday of each month at Poplar Bluff Armory, 1605 Cravens Road in Poplar Bluff. In order to receive food, veterans should bring an identification card and a box to carry the food. In addition to food, the SEMO Food Bank staff will be on-site occasionally to conduct Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Medicaid application assistance.
