SEMO FOOD BANK EXPANDS FOOD DRIVE EFFORTS

Sikeston, MO (June 15, 2021) - Southeast Missouri Food Bank has expanded its food drive efforts with a virtual food drive program called Fenly.

When COVID-19 hit, the food bank faced limited food donations. To combat this, a push was made toward virtual food drives. Instead of donating physical items, donors could pick from items online, then donate money to go toward those items.

"Initially, we created our own virtual food drive page, but it wasn't as user friendly as we wanted it to be," said Justin Mann, SEMO Food Bank digital media specialist. "We eventually decided on Fenly due to how easy it is to use and because of its mission to help end hunger."

The software was created by Maryland Food Bank and then shared with other food banks and hunger relief organizations. It allows individuals to start their own food drive and promote on their social media sites. Companies can also start a food drive with employees having their own individual fundraising page.

"This platform is great for a company to start a food drive and then challenge its employees or other companies in the same service sector to do the same" Mann said. "It's a good way to start some friendly competition."

Virtual food drives help the food bank provide food to the families, children and seniors who are most in need, and dollars can be used to acquire the currently most needed items. Because of its food-buying resources, the food bank can leverage donations to acquire more food than a consumer can for the same amount of money in a grocery store. One in six households in Southeast Missouri is food insecure, meaning it doesn't have the resources to acquire enough food.
