Wells Fargo Holiday Food Bank Program Raises \$5,380 for Southeast Missouri Food Bank

Sikeston, MO (Feb. 4, 2020) – The Southeast Missouri community helped raise \$5,380 for local families in need through the Wells Fargo Holiday Food Bank program. In its third year, Wells Fargo engaged the public in its nationwide campaign to donate money and non-perishable food for local food banks and bring national attention to the issue of hunger.

In Southeast Missouri, one in six people struggles with hunger. Hunger also impacts one in five children in our community.

"Southeast Missouri Food Bank and its member agencies work hard every day to help people who may not know where they will find their next meal," said Joseph Keys, chief executive officer at the food bank. "We are tremendously grateful to Wells Fargo and everyone in our community who helped to support the Holiday Food Bank campaign."

Funds from the program will provide more than 21,500 meals to struggling Southeast Missouri families.
